Neues von TV Stud Tarifverträge für studentische Beschäftigte

Hot November and plenary meeting of all student employees

Hey, we are TV Stud!

We campaign for better working conditions for student employees at the university. There are 300,000 student employees in Germany, about 1,500 in Mainz alone - without us, nothing would work at the university. Nevertheless, we are often paid from 'material resources' and are so far explicitly excluded from the collective agreement of the federal states (TV-L) - the largest wage gap in the public sector! Many of our colleagues at the university know about similar problems: chain contracts, little money, unpaid overtime and much more. The TV-L is currently being negotiated and we have had enough: HiWis are not office chairs! We want a collective agreement for student employees (TV Stud). Unfortunately, the Tarifgemeinschaft deutscher Länder (TdL) is currently blocking all improvements - but we can achieve them together with you in the current collective bargaining. For this we need public pressure from all of us NOW!

There are some dates in the 'hot November' where you can stand up for your rights or actively show solidarity. The dates are mainly aimed at (student) employees - but we also call on all our fellow students to show solidarity and stand by our side there.

Student housing in Mainz - too little and too expensive!

The city of Mainz offers many advantages that make it an attractive university location for students.

Housing is not one of them.

We all face the problem of finding affordable housing in the city's overpriced housing market before we begin our studies or during the course of our studies. This often results in having to cut back on other vital areas and work alongside studies just to be able to afford the human right of housing.

The conditions are not laws of nature, but politically intended.

Instead of policies that drive up prices and cater to the interests of a few shareholders, we advocate for affordable and demand-responsive housing for students. With every additional affordable apartment, the entire housing market is relieved and in particular financially worse off groups of people are helped.

But for this to happen, there must be a change at the state and city levels. We want to work with committed individuals on campus and in the city toward a city where everyone can afford to live.

The Department of Political Education would like to inform about the following initiatives: The AfD is planning its federal party conference on December 11 and 12, 2021, at the RheinMain CongressCenter (RMCC) in Wiesbaden, Hesse, near Frankfurt am Main. In cooperation with the Wiesbaden Alliance Against the Right and the nationwide Alliance Stand Up Against Racism, a broad supra-regional coalition of organizations is organizing creative, colorful and diverse protest actions from December 10 to 12, with mobilizations taking place nationwide. Solidarity with victims, consequences for perpetrators - Demonstration against sexualized violence

On November 25, 2021, we want to loudly take to the streets in the fight against sexualized and patriarchal violence. Even the university is not free of sexualized violence, so this year we will demonstrate on the JGU campus.

November 25 is the International Day Against Patriarchal Violence and feminist groups around the world call for action on this day. Patriarchal violence has different forms and works together with other forms of oppression. It expresses itself as sexualized violence and also as structural violence against girls, women, lesbians, intersex, non-binary, trans, agender and queer people.

As the current case also shows, on which the AStA has also published a statement, the university is currently not a safe place for victims of sexualized violence. In cases of sexualized violence, convictions rarely occur. Taking responsibility must therefore not depend on judicial decisions. However, sexualized violence has consequences for those affected and should therefore not remain without consequences for perpetrators. We demand that the university shows solidarity and uses its possibilities for action, listens to those affected and offers them protection.

The rally will begin at noon on the university campus at the Forum. A march is then planned across campus followed by a final rally at the starting point.

Let's be loud and in solidarity! Together we let the patriarchy crumble piece by piece!

Students of the University of Mainz and the ISSK can apply for interest-free loans

and grants in case of financial hardship, e.g. for semester fees, rent and health insurance. Even if you have lost your job in the current situation or have financial problems in some other way, you can apply to us. An emergency situation is not your fault if it has arisen through no fault of your own and you are unable to remedy it on your own. Further information is available here.

Temporary help for application processing support in the social affairs department

The department of social affairs is looking for a temporary employee. You would support the office mainly in the processing of applications to the student aid fund.

In detail, the work includes the following tasks:

- Preparing applications for the student aid fund (loans, free tables, grants) for further processing and decision-making
- Reviewing applications received for completeness, contacting applicants (multiple times) if necessary to complete applications and responding to follow-up questions from applicants
- Sorting of subsequent submissions
- Follow-up and filing of processed applications
- Feedback to applicants on approval/rejection of applications according to application procedures
- Other general office duties (forwarding other inquiries, office supplies, sorting digital materials, etc.)

You should have the following prerequisites:

- Independent, focused, dedicated and reliable work ethic
- Conscientious handling of confidential data
- Knowledge of word processing and e-mail program
- Good English and German spoken and written

What we offer you:

The position is remunerated based on TV-L pay group E2 level 1 (currently 13.36€ / hour).

The job must be done in the office of the AStA, since the applications may not be processed at home for reasons of data protection. Home office is therefore not possible.

Start of employment is the earliest possible date. The working hours are on average about 5 hours per week. We will clarify the exact modalities in a direct conversation.
